



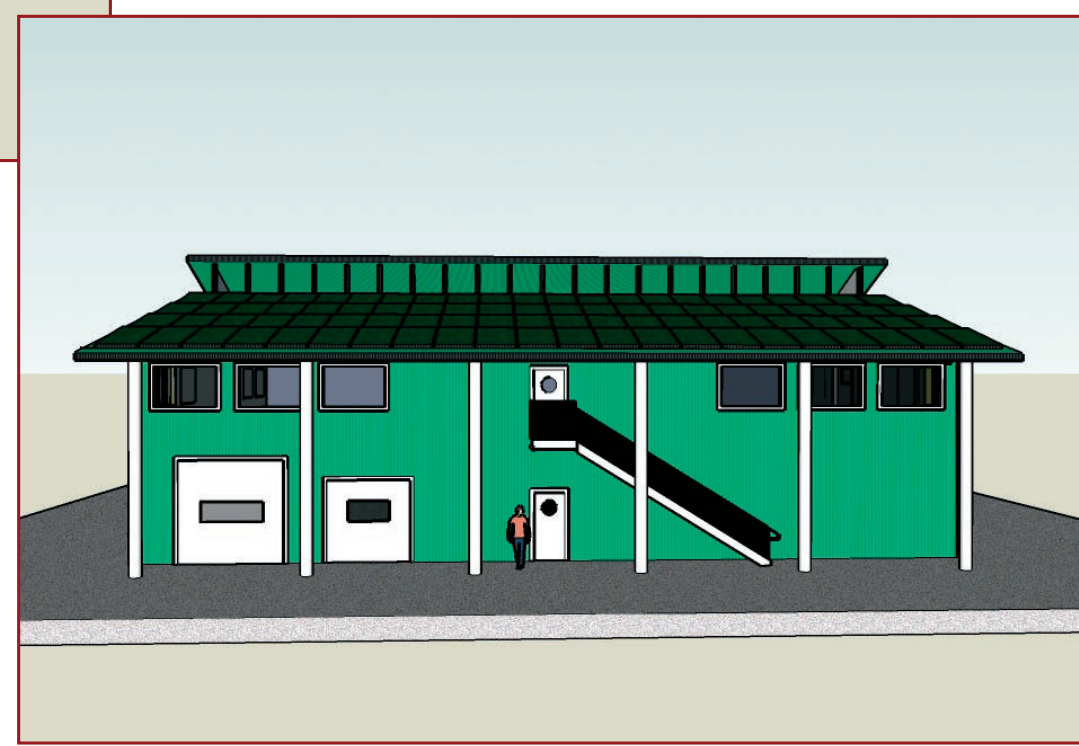
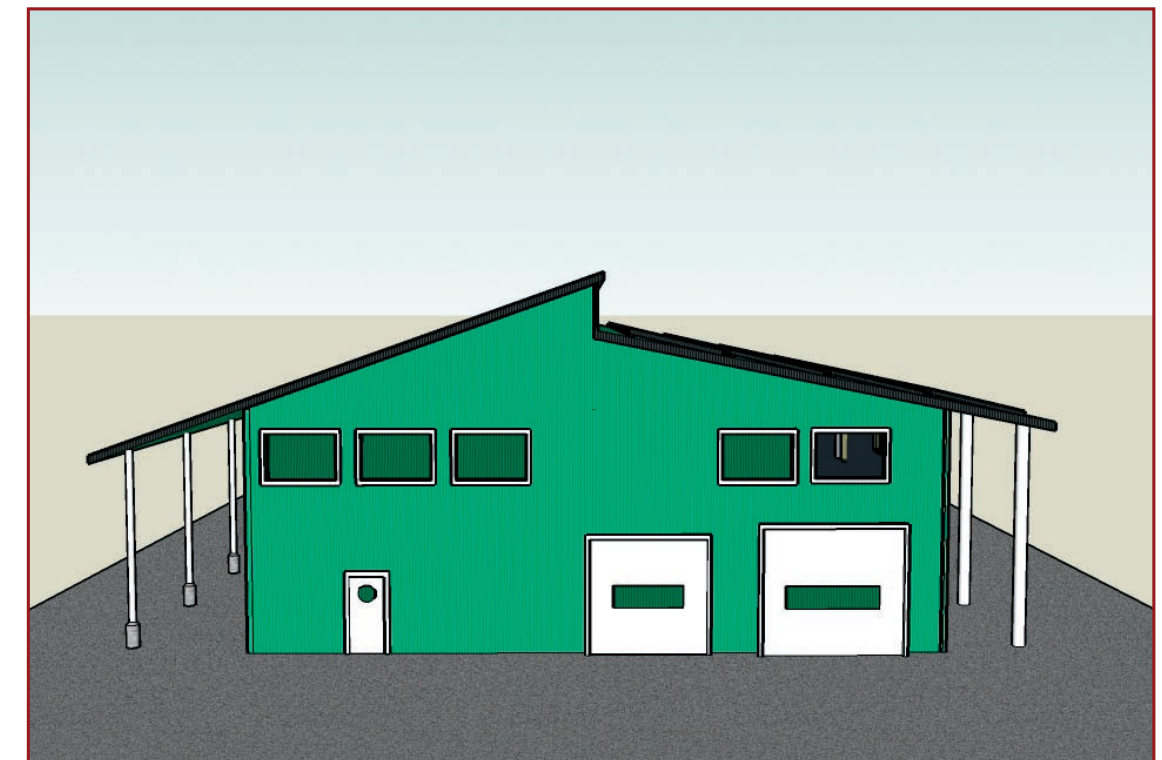
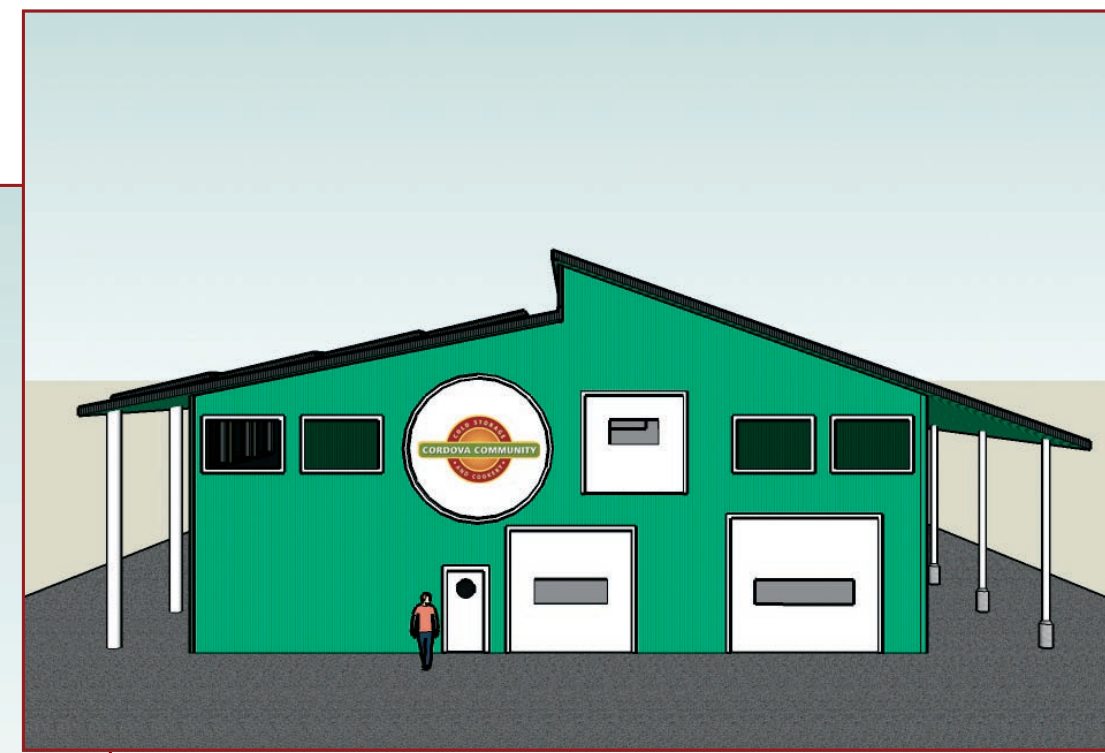
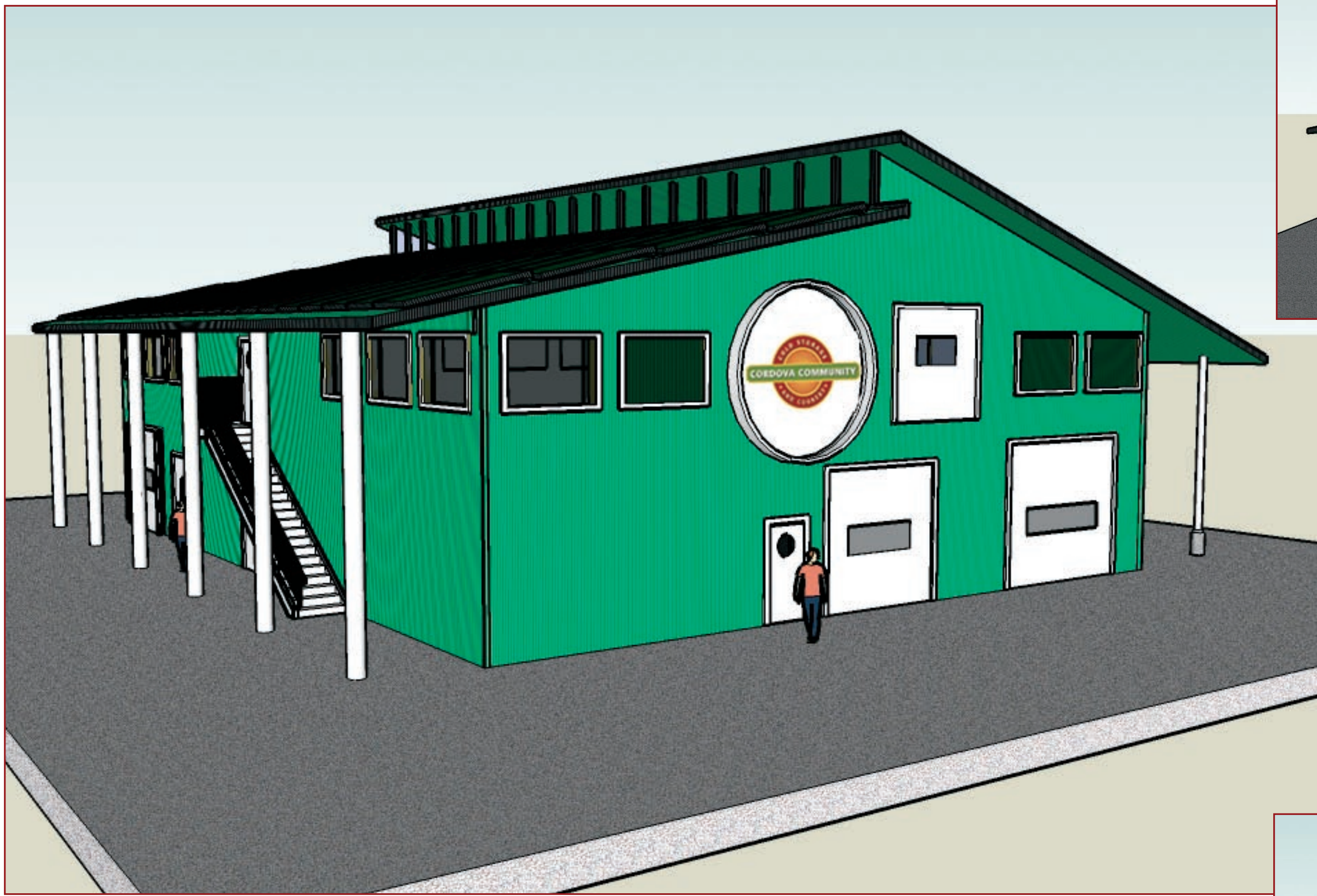
CCS'S MISSION AND OBJECTIVES

Mission:

As a community, to improve and value-add methods of handling our subsistence and commercial foods in order to retain, enhance and preserve our unique subsistence-based culture and heritage.

Objectives:

To provide a DEC approved facility that is affordable and sustainable for our communities needs; through community participation, to provide high-quality wholesome foods for our rural community, and to expand direct-market and cottage industry opportunity and income streams for our region and its residents.



How will CCS be organized?

- LLC Corporation with a Board of Directors
- An Advisory Board of community members
- Staff – that includes:
 - Facility Manager
 - Part-time Bookkeeper
 - Custodian
 - Scheduler
 - Seasonal processing crew

Who is CCS's market?

- Support from community subsistence lifestyles
- Subsequent direct-marketing of value-added seafoods
- Tourists and sport fishers

How will the CCS be financed?

- Low rate “time and supplies” charges to Cordova residents
- Higher charges to non-local users
- Donations can come from individuals, corporations, Cordova visitors and local non-profit organizations, some of which are involved in the CCS as founders
- Foundations, State and Federal community assistance grants
- Income from direct sales at the site from community member's products
